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## Field Observations Assignment

### Approach

I will be observing the lounge/commons area in the Odegaard Undergraduate Library to answer the question of whether MAC or PC is more popular and what factors affect a person in choosing one over the other. I will situate myself in a high traffic area as to experience a greater amount of people, hear the most conversation and to get the most out of each visit. In observing the site, I will locate myself in a spot within the subject's domain, but I will use unobtrusive means in that I will not be talking to them – just observing. There will be no need to have conversations, just studying the subjects' use of technology, their clothing, their dialogue, etc. However, because Odegaard is a very popular study spot, I may encounter my friends and other people that I know. In this case, I will not discuss what I am doing to a great extent, in order to prevent people near me from over hearing and feeling uncomfortable. This will minimize people questioning what I am doing and also minimize my effect on their behavior.

I will do my observations on different days and at different times in order to get a wide range of people. I will go on different days of the week because people who go to the library at certain days have different subjects to study for, different schedules, etc. I will also go at different times throughout the day because then I can capture people with different personalities – for example those who like to go to the library in the morning and in the evening. By choosing varying days and times, it will also randomize the subjects I observe and therefore give me a more accurate and representative set of data. Each observation should take up to an hour including travel time – 45 minutes for an observation and 15 minutes for travel. I will draw a detailed map of my observation location in my notebook as soon as I pick a location to place myself in. This will be used to keep a log of the times people arrive and leave, as well as their flow of movement. After I have done this I will start typing field notes on the computer while simultaneously sketching on the map. After I do my observations I will go home and fill in any details I remember as well. The next times I do observations I will make a simpler map prior to my arrival at Odegaard so that I can go straight into observations and field notes without wasting any time.

### Analysis of the Structure and Hierarchy

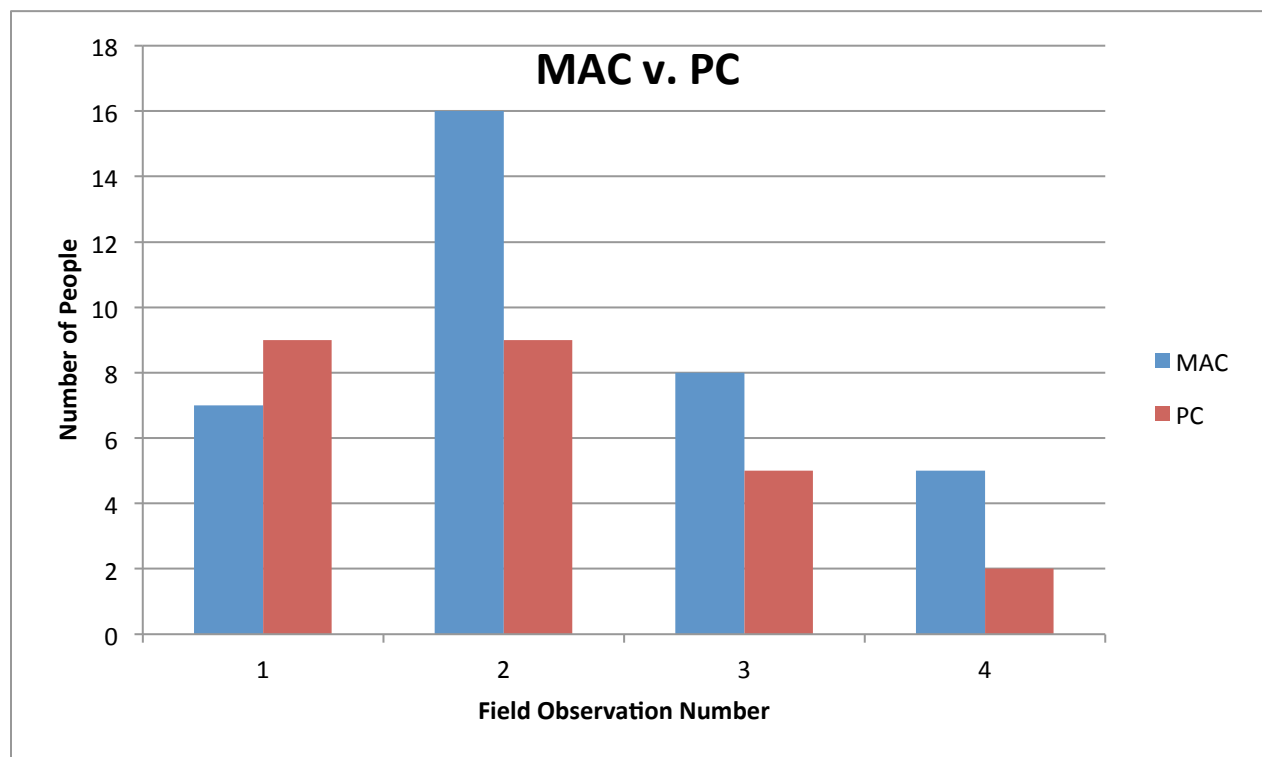
After doing four field observations at the Odegaard Undergraduate Library, an apparent structure and hierarchy of my object of study emerged. First, the layout of Odegaard shows different layers of power. Close to the main entrance of the library holds the most power. This is where the information desk is which is where the student employees sit to check student ID for entrance to the library after 8 PM. These people are the gatekeepers, they control who can come in and they also have the power to kick people out. Because I am a student at the University of

Washington, I do not have to worry about this. However, if a person came into the library after 8 PM they would not be allowed access because of this rule.

Second, the middle commons area of Odegaard is structured to give individuals space in-between each other. The chairs are big and bulky which, physically, does not allow them to be too close to one another. Most people that come here come by themselves or in pairs and they rarely come with more people than this. There were no big group relationships. In general, people who sit in this area are on their laptops, on their phones, or quietly reading a book/taking notes. Therefore, all the people in this area of the library are equals. However, in the area surrounding this commons area there are numerous large tables for groups of people, big white boards and large screen TVs which all encourage group work and collaboration. In this area, each individual group will have their unique hierarchy and roles in their group project.

### Analysis of Themes in MAC and PC Owners

Through my observations I have seen an overall trend of more MAC users than PC users. The data I gathered from my observations are shown below.



While I collected the data to get this chart, I also observed each person with a MAC or PC to see if I could discover a theme in the types of people that choose MAC and the people that choose PC. I found that there was a theme in laptop design and accessories. In my observations, I saw that the majority of people who own MACs accessorize their laptops in comparison to those who own PCs. In general, females would accessorize their MACs with laptop covers and matching keyboard covers. Some females and males would decorate their MACs with stickers that are

probably bought and not just given to them for free. Most males would keep their MAC clean, without any accessories. For example, female subject 9 in field notes 2 had a mint laptop cover and a matching mint keyboard cover. She also had a blue laptop case and a blue cell phone case. It was more common to see this occurrence in females that had MACs than in any other situation. Also, male subjects 12 and 8 in field notes 2 put black silhouette stickers on their laptop covers. In my experience, these types of stickers are common for MAC users and are usually bought online for an average of ten dollars. On the other hand, people with PCs generally did not accessorize their laptops. If they did, they accessorized it with commonly found stickers. For example, male subject 3 in field notes 3 had a CEP sticker and a green tree sticker on his PC. Both stickers seemed to have been placed randomly on the cover. CEP stands for Community, Environment and Planning, a major at the UW and the green tree sticker probably symbolizes sustainability to pair with the CEP sticker. Both of these stickers are most likely obtained for free from his major department. Also, female subject 3 from field notes 2 had a colorful Hello Kitty sticker on her laptop cover. I did not see any PC owners who put a cover or keyboard cover on their laptops.

Generalizing from my observations, people with PCs are more likely to put accessories on their laptops that are less expensive and obtained for free or no accessories at all. I see a pattern that most PC users do not seem to care about the decorations and accessories to their laptops. Because more MACs had laptop covers than PCs, I believe that the cover is not necessarily used to protect the laptop, but more so to enhance its beauty. Like this, MAC users are influenced by the design of the laptop. They are the people who like to have an aesthetically pleasing laptop which they either keep clean to maintain the MAC's sleek and minimal design, or they accessorize it with cases, covers and stickers that they buy online to enhance its attractiveness and to add their own personality.

### Reflection

My initial plan worked well. I followed the structure as I originally intended and stuck to one observation site but visited it on different days and at different times throughout each day. I think that this was important to do in order to avoid any kind of bias. Next time I would improve on the structure by doing an additional field observation late at night as the latest I observed was up until 6:35 PM. In doing so, I would get the most data possible from a wide variety of people.

As I did more observations, the better and faster I got at taking notes and observing multiple people at once. My notes also became more elaborate and I noted more details of every individual. These details that I did not include in my first field observation were actually crucial to my analysis. For example, in my first observation I did not take note of any accessories people had on their electronics. However, this was a vital part of my analysis. I learned to write everything down, even if I am not sure what it is or what it means. For instance, subject 3 in field notes 3 had a CEP sticker on his PC. I did not know what this sticker meant, but I noted it and when I got home I looked it up. After finding out that it stood for his major at the UW, I found that this sticker tells me a lot about this person's interest and personality.

Next time I would stay at each site for an hour. During these observations of 30-45 minutes I sometimes found myself with not enough people to write about because there was not enough traffic of people. For example, in the morning there were not that many people to observe. In contrast, sometimes there were too many people to write about that I ran out of time. I think that it is important not to skip observations at certain times of the day, therefore by staying for a longer period of time this problem could be eliminated.

I would also more closely analyze other possible explanatory variables for why a user would choose MAC or PC besides focusing on just the accessories, what people are wearing, or any other aspect that I can only obtain through observation. I could do this by integrating interviews into my research. By interviewing people, I can get a deeper understanding of their personality, interests and learn about them on a personal level. I can learn about the programs they most frequently use on their laptops, whether they are gaming programs, coding programs, designing programs or any other kinds of programs. I would be able to be more aware of the other variables that could impact a person's decision. For example, maybe socio-economic status has an impact. Maybe then I could find out holistically what influences a person in their decision of MAC or PC.

### Ethics

As I was doing my research, I came across the feeling of overpassing a person's personal space. I tried to overhear people's conversations in order to note key phrases and tried to look on their laptop screens to see what they were doing. This is a possible ethical dilemma because it can be seen as an invasion of privacy.

For future research, I would include interviews in my study. Therefore I will be able to get their consent before talking to them, which will also help in gaining more knowledge about each person. Therefore they will also be aware that I am a researcher and not feel as uncomfortable while I take notes. Although this may affect my research in that people may act differently, this would eliminate the problem of crossing ethical borders.

#### **Field Notes 1**

January 28, 2014  
8:15 – 9:00 AM  
Odegaard Library

I am located on the ground floor in the center to left of the stairs when looking at the entrance from inside – refer to diagram. I will be observing only the people sitting at the orange floors and couches – the people in my view.

Coding will be done in square brackets.

## Layout

- 5 tall lamps with a white cloth shade coming out of the tables
  - o There are also two similar lights hanging from the ceiling at the entrance
- 3 long gray tables situated at different angles with an orange padding on one side for sitting/ putting your feet up
  - o One table is directly below the stairs
- 5 little circular tables are placed around the area as well, 2 to the left of the stairs looking at the entrance from the inside and three under the stairs
- Stripe patterned carpeting with big patches of orange carpeting at each section of tabling
- Modern minimalistic style
- Stairs are a light wood with metal
  - o The wood used for the stairs is also used in the ceiling above the lounge area, long pieces of wood spaced apart in a design for aesthetics but also to let light in. They are more spread apart in the center of the ceiling
- This lounge/commons area is out in the open and can be seen from any floor
- Chairs are big, gray and a “lazy” style and about 12 chairs per long table (keeps the distance between each person, doesn’t allow people to sit too close to one another)
- One bookshelf with not many books (probably used to display certain books and also decoration)
  - o No one looked at the books on the bookshelf during my time of observation
- One shelf behind me for DVD display
  - o No one looked at the DVDs during my time of observation
- The renovation of the library gives Odegaard a mixed modern and traditional look
- Information desk at the front with one person sitting down at the table
- Area surrounding all sides of the commons area have tables for group work, big white boards and large screen TVs
- (Atmosphere is very collaborative surrounding the commons area to encourage group work and conversation. The middle area is more for individuals to sit and wait for people to arrive, or work on things by themselves.)

## Computer Usage

- MAC: 7 – 4 male, 3 female
- PC: 9 – 5 male, 4 female

## Activities

- Many people on laptops with headphones on (Possibly listening to music, watching videos, watching/listening to lectures),
- A couple people reading and taking notes/highlighting
- One person is reading a packet, taking notes, while listening to something on his laptop
- A girl is on their phone (Possibly waiting for class to start or for a friend to arrive)
- Another girl is standing around and on her phone (Maybe waiting for someone to arrive)
- One girl is on her tablet (Why is she using a tablet and not a laptop?)
- None of these people are talking to each other (Maybe this could be due to the time of day?)
- Around my site of observation, people are filtering in and out

### Body Language

- Legs up on the couch/table
- Legs straight on couch/table
- Legs crossed
- Hunched over onto the short table/couch
- (Each could possibly infer the person's amount of stress/relaxation)

### Reflections

Not that many people are at Odegaard in the morning and there is not as much collaboration. It would be a good idea to do observations during different times of the day. Next time I should also note in more detail what people are wearing, what they are talking about and their accessories as these can tell me more about themselves. Then it would be easier to analyze their choices in choosing MAC or PC.

### Reflections

I think that the spot I chose is a good location because there is a lot of traffic. It is a good location to get data from many different people within my time of field observation. People who come and sit here do not stay for too long. Therefore I can observe a wider range of people and observe what type of laptop they use. Maybe half way through my time observing I could move to a different seat in this area of the library, then I can more closely observe what other people are doing and what kinds of conversation they are having.

#### Reflections

Not that many people come to Odegaard on Sunday. This could be due to the Super Bowl as well. It seemed like a lot of the people who came in were just waiting for someone to arrive or to pass spare time they had.
